The Community Development Worker for Traveller Men's Health will work with CRTHP to engage directly with Traveller Men throughout the County and service providers to address and highlight the health needs and issues in the community. The successful applicant will be required to work as part of a team and have:

- Qualification in Health /Community Development Related Discipline
- And/or training in Community Development or Health
- Experience of delivering health related activities
- Experience of working with the Traveller community
- Excellent communication skills
- Excellent computer skills- Word, Excel and Email
- Ability to identify needs and arrange activities accordingly
- Experience of working one to one with clients
- Excellent understanding of Traveller health and the issues that affect the health and wellbeing
- Demonstrated ability to work on own initiative and as part of a team
- Experience in facilitating group activities for Children, Young People and Adults
- A full clean driving licence and own transport to be used at work is essential

The Healthcare professional will co-ordinate the Primary Health Care Programme for Travellers based in Co Roscommon, which involves door to door outreach work. The successful applicant will be required to work as part of a team and have:

- A relevant third level qualification (minimum Level 7) in a Health Science/Health promotion or Nursing background
- An understanding of primary health care, working from a community development approach as part of a team
- Experience of delivering health focused activities
- An understanding of health policy and practice
- An understanding of Traveller issues and cultural diversity
- Group facilitation skills and experience of group work
- Planning, evaluation and administration skills

- Knowledge of Staff support and Supervision
- Awareness and sensitivity to literacy issues
- Knowledge of HSE KPI Requirements
- Excellent communication skills
