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Green Light for LEADER Programme 2014- 2020 in Co. Roscommon

The roll out of the LEADER Programme 2014-2020 in Co. Roscommon has taken a major step forward with the contract for the delivery of the programme recently being signed between the Dept. of Arts, Heritage, Regional, Rural & Gaeltacht Affairs and the Local Action Group, Roscommon Local Community Development Committee and its Implementation and Financial Partners, Roscommon LEADER Partnership and Roscommon County Council respectively.

The project allocation for Co. Roscommon is €6.5 million which will be will be distributed to entrepreneurs and community groups throughout the county. The LEADER Programme 2014-2020 can fund projects under a diverse range of themes that include enterprise development, rural tourism, social inclusion and the environment. The programme is co-financed by the European Agricultural Fund for Rural Development and the Irish Government. The previous LEADER Programme delivered almost 10,000 projects throughout rural Ireland. In addition to supporting community-based projects, LEADER 2007-2013 funding supported over 800 enterprises and 500 jobs nationally.

Speaking recently, Heather Humphreys TD, Minister for Arts, Heritage, Regional, Rural and Gaeltacht Affairs said: "The LEADER Programme will deliver some €250 million into rural towns and villages right across the country over the next four years. By signing the funding agreements with the Local Action Groups, we are unlocking this vital funding for rural Ireland."

"I know that communities across the country are very eager to access this funding, for the benefit of local groups and organisations. LEADER is an incredibly important source of funding for rural towns and villages, and I am confident that the €250 million fund will support significant job creation in the coming years. One of the great strengths of the LEADER programme is that it puts funding decisions in the hands of the communities where the money is spent; local decisions by local people. The LEADER Programme will fund a wide variety of projects over the coming years; projects large or small; projects with economic, social or environmental dimensions."

"LEADER is built on local people facilitated by Local Action Groups. The investment provided through LEADER at a national level can only make a meaningful impact with the vision and effort of community groups and entrepreneurs at a local level. I look forward to facilitating their work, and funding their investments, in the coming years."

The signing of the contract with the Dept. paves the way for the roll-out of the programme across Co. Roscommon. A series of information meetings will be held in various venues around Co. Roscommon during October and November. Further details of this will be available on the Roscommon LEADER Partnership website


Positive Ageing Week

A total of 16 participants are taking part in these courses with a further 15 candidates to commence training

<u>Creative employment - the focus of major Ballaghaderreen Conference</u>

Roscommon LEADER Partnership, along with development agency partners, held a major conference in Ballaghaderreen on Friday 22nd July last, outlining the immense opportunity creative entrepreneurship has in creating new employment opportunities and transforming the local community of Ballaghaderreen. The conference, on the day, was facilitated in the Northern and Western Regional Assembly.


The conference began with an address from the Chairman of Roscommon LEADER Partnership, Micheál Frain, to the one

hundred plus attendees comprised of speakers, regional alliance members and delegates. Mr. Frain acknowledged Ballaghaderreen's huge potential and the opportunity it presented for entrepreneurs in the creative sector. Special guest, Minister for Jobs, Enterprise and Innovation. Mary Mitchell O'Connor TD, made a connection with Ballaghaderreen through her own grassroots growing up in rural Galway.

Underpinning this project is the desire to transform local communities and tackle dilapidated buildings whilst nurturing new creative entrepreneurs to set up their business in towns such as Ballaghaderreen. This desire resonated with an array of guest speakers advocating the benefits of creative communities and dealing with rural affairs. At the event, speakers such as John Higgins, a passionate and proven advocate of rural communities, Brian McAuley of Dungannon Enterprise Centre, who oversaw the transformation of 13 steel shipping containers into enterprise hubs, and Deirdre Mortel, CEO of Social Innovation Fund Ireland, spoke passionately about their knowledge of dealing with the creative sector.

The conference was a magnet for illustrious and renowned entrepreneurs who have etched their identity in the world of creative industry. Speakers, many of whom were natives of Co. Roscommon, travelled from as far as the UK to share their experiences of the creative sector. The eclectic mix of speakers included Úna Burke, a multi-award winning luxury leather accessories designer and artist, Shane Deasy, founder of an Irish Wi-Fi business called Bitbuzz, and Alan Duggan, CEO of Tribal City Interactive, and a stalwart of the mobile games industry.

Launch of CCIC Toolkit: With the conference being a multiplier event*, Dr Paddy Tobin, head of the Centre for Creative Arts & Media GMIT, launched one of the first outputs of the Creative Communities Igniting Change project, a Toolkit for the Establishment of Creative Communities Regional Alliances. The toolkit was developed as a set of resources to support partners and stakeholders to actively engage in the development of Regional Alliance groups. The Ignite Training Course was also launched on the day, which aims to upskill, train and mentor participants in areas of business start-up while encouraging sustainability with its purpose built programmes. Ignite is a proven training course on Creative Entrepreneurship which you can incorporate into your organisation. The Youth Fair will showcase some of the youth organisations from within the region and also from neighbouring jurisdictions. The Youth Fair will be officially opened by Roscommon Football Manager, Fergal O'Donnell.

The event will play host to the story of a successful young entrepreneur working in the arts. Catherine Simon will detail her experiences as founder and artistic director of Drama Works Ireland, which facilitates multidisciplinary theatre training in educational settings. At the event, youth workers will receive free information packs containing valuable youth work aids.

The Youth Fair will also launch the Erasmus+ Youth Services Directory and an On and Off-Line Mapping Service, which was updated by Comhairle na nÓg in conjunction with Roscommon LEADER Partnership and Galway & Roscommon Education and Training Board (GRETB). - Older people are loyal customers
- Older consumers will double in number in the next 30 years, and those over 80 will quadruple.

As part of Roscommon Age Friendly Strategy, a Trusted Tradesmen Initiative is being launched, aimed at both supporting older people in the community to avoid rogue traders as well as enhance the economic viability of local tradespeople.

Participants graduate from the Asthma Society of Ireland Traveller Health Programme in Roscommon

The Asthma Society of Ireland (ASI) certified 15 Traveller Community Health Workers in Roscommon, Longford & Loughrea recently on completion of five days training as part of the 'Traveller Health Asthma Education Programme'. programme was delivered by ASI in partnership with the HSE. The successful participants then went on educate their community on asthma and asthma control messages where a number of individuals were signposted to their GP.

The Traveller Health Programme aims to empower Traveller Healthcare Workers to disseminate asthma information to members of their community through information evenings, asthma awareness events and/or on a one-to-one basis during health visits.

Research highlights that 60% of people with asthma do not have it controlled and we also know that two out of three people with asthma have incorrect inhaler technique. This programme focuses on upskilling TCHW's in the correct inhaler technique for various inhalers available in Ireland as part of asthma control messaging.

All participants are supplied with resource packs containing a range of devices and educational aids to assist with disseminating messages to members of their community. This training also equips participants with the information and skills to spot uncontrolled asthma and the key steps to regain control of your asthma.
